OBJETIVOS DE LA ASIGNATURA:

1. SERVIR DE BASE TEÓRICA Y COMPLEMENTARIA PARA LA ASIGNATURA LENGUA INGLESA I Y FONÉTICA INGLESA I, BRINDANDO AL ALUMNO EL CONOCIMIENTO CIENTÍFICO DE LOS DISTINTOS ITEMS GRAMATICALES ESENCIALES Y LA MANERA EN QUE ESTOS SE ESTRUCTURAN, DE MODO TAL QUE LOS ALUMNOS PUEDAN INCORPORARLOS AL USO DE LA LENGUA, TANTO ESCRITA COMO ORAL.
2. PROPORCIONAR A LOS ALUMNOS EJERCITACIÓN ADECUADA E INTENSIVA PARA EL USO DE LAS ESTRUCTURAS GRAMATICALES QUE FAVOREZCAN EL PROCESO DE COMUNICACIÓN EN LA LENGUA INGLESA.
3. CONTRIBUIR A LA ADQUISICIÓN DE DESTREZAS QUE AYUDEN A LOS ALUMNOS A DESARROLLAR SUS HABILIDADES COGNITIVAS, QUE FACILITEN EL USO DE LA LENGUA, TALES COMO: RAZONAR, RELACIONAR, ENUNCIAR, EJEMPLIFICAR, COMPARAR, CONTRASTAR, DEDUCIR, INFERIR, ETC.

UNIT I: LINGUISTIC UNITS: CLAUSE, PHRASE, WORD, MORPHEME, WORD CLASSES: OPEN AND CLOSED. PHRASE ANALYSIS OF SENTENCES: WORD AND PHRASE LEVELS.

UNIT III: THE VERB AS A WORD CLASS. FULL AND AUXILIARY VERBS. AFFIRMATIVE, INTERROGATIVE AND NEGATIVE SENTENCES. ASSERTIVE AND NON-ASSERTIVE ITEMS. NEGATION AND INVERSION. AUXILIARIES: PRIMARY AND MODAL. FINITENESS AND NONFINITENESS. THE MORPHOLOGY OF THE VERB: BASE, PAST, PRESENT PARTICIPLE, PAST PARTICIPLE, THIRD PERSON SIMPLE PRESENT FORM. SPELLING RULES. PAST FORM: REGULAR AND IRREGULAR.

UNIT IV: TENSE: PAST AND PRESENT. MORPHOLOGICAL RULES OF TENSED VERBS. ASPECT: PROGRESSIVE AND PERFECTIVE. TENSE USES: EVENTS, STATES AND HABITS. ADVERBS IN RELATION TO TENSES. DYNAMIC AND STATIVE VERBS. CATENATIVE VERBS. DIFFERENCE IN MEANING. AMBIGUOUS SENTENCES.

UNIT V: WAYS OF EXPRESSING FUTURE: WILL/SHALL, BE GOING TO, PRESENT PROGRESSIVE, PRESENT SIMPLE, WILL/SHALL + V-ING. USES.

UNIT VI: NOUNS: COMMON AND PROPER, CONCRETE AND ABSTRACT. COUNTABILITY. PARTITIVE EXPRESSIONS. QUANTITY AND QUALITY.

UNIT VII: DETERMINERS: PRE-, POST-, AND THE CENTRAL DETERMINERS. THE ARTICLE: DEFINITE, INDEFINITE AND ZERO. THE ARTICLE AND ITS USES. THE ARTICLE AND REFERENCE. GENERIC AND SPECIFIC REFERENCE. PROPER NOUNS: GRAMMATICAL FEATURES AND TYPES.

UNIT VIII: NUMBER: SINGULAR, PLURAL, AND DUAL. MORPHOLOGICAL RULES. FOREIGN PLURALS. GENDER: ANIMATE AND INANIMATE; PERSONAL AND NON-PERSONAL; MASCULINE, FEMENINE AND DUAL. CASE: COMMON AND GENITIVE. THE GENITIVE: INFLECTED, PERIPHRASTIC, INDEPENDENT, POST-GENITIVE. GENITIVE MEANINGS.
